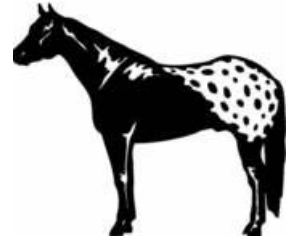

General Rules:

1. Any member of WApHC in good standing may nominate one or more entries in the futurity.
2. All owners and exhibitors of nominated horses must be **MEMBERS** of WApHC. **Membership must be paid before futurity paperwork is submitted. Memberships get mailed to a different person.**
3. In case of a leased mare for weanling nomination, the legal papers from Moscow must be sent with nomination.
4. All entries must be registered with the Appaloosa Horse Club, Moscow, Idaho. Horses with NC PAPERS ARE ALLOWED ONLY in the WEANLING division. All others MUST have show papers.
5. In the case of change of ownership, the futurity rights remain with the horse. The new owner must be a member of WApHC and the Futurity Chairman must have show papers.
6. NO SUBSTITUTIONS will be allowed for nominated horses.
7. ALL PAYMENTS are DUE on or BEFORE the Due Dates. The POSTMARK will determine the date of mailed payment.
8. COPIES of BOTH sides of the horse's REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST accompany ALL nominations. In the case of WEANLINGS, COPIES of BOTH sides of the MARE'S PAPERS are REQUIRED plus the STALLION'S NAME and REGISTRATION NUMBER.
 - A. To be a legal nomination, copies of registration papers MUST ACCOMPANY payment.
 - B. Nominations WITHOUT PROPER FUNDS or PAPER WORK will be RETURNED to the nominating member for correction and payment of ADDITIONAL FEES if required.
9. All WEANLING nominations MUST have a NOMINATION FORM with EACH PAYMENT or they might get put in the wrong class or not in a class at all.
10. ORIGINAL PAPERS or copies of original papers are REQUIRED for each entry on the DAY of the Futurity for weanlings. BOTH SIDES are required if a copy is used. All other papers must accompany your nomination forms.
11. Non-Pros must carry current year card to be eligible for Non-pro monies. Non-pro cards will be checked the day of the futurity.
12. All nominations will be shown in the corresponding open class and are required to pay the open class fee.
13. All entries must show under all judges.
14. Regarding nomination of stallions and/or geldings, once nominated as a stallion, the horse can be transferred to gelding division provided that the Futurity Chairman is notified in writing prior to the show.
15. The governing board consisting of two or more members from WApHC and the Futurity Chairman must approve all Futurity rule changes.
16. Nominated weanling monies will be divided by proper sex. The monies from foals of unknown sex will be divided evenly.
17. If you scratch or are unable to show you CAN NOT get your money back!!
18. Unless previously stated, the Wisconsin State Appaloosa Futurity follows the rules and guidelines of the ApHC.
19. **If there is only one horse in a Futurity Class you will be refunded your money and the class will be cancelled.**
20. **There will be no REFUNDS for any reason, with the exception of aborting or still born.**

WApHC Regional Year-End Awards Program & Rules

The Board of Directors of WApHC shall act as the Year-End Awards Committee. The duties of the committee include:

1. Selection of the areas of competition that will be eligible for Year-End Awards during the current year.
2. Selection of a point chairman to record and publish points gained by eligible exhibitors and/or eligible horses in their respective areas of competition.
3. Selection and approval of shows that will provide the necessary competition required for gaining points.
4. Provide Year-End Awards for each area of competition that is eligible during the current year.
5. Serve as the final arbitrator in any and all disputes according to Section II-G 3 of WApHC by-laws.

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Only members of WApHC are eligible to participate in the Year-End Awards Program. Membership must be obtained prior to the show you wish to submit for points.
2. You must nominate yourself for those categories in which you wish to compete, and nomination fees must be paid prior to the first show in order for points to count.
3. Ages of all exhibitors will be as of January 1st of the current year.
4. To be eligible to participate in the WApHC Year End Awards Program, all horses must be registered within the rules of the Appaloosa Horse Club, Inc., Moscow, Idaho. For the horse to be shown in competition for Regional Year End Awards, all owners must be members of WApHC. If a horse is sold during the show season, the points remain with the horse provided the new owners become members at the time of sale. Also required is a copy (front and back) of the horse's registration papers.
5. Eligibility is gained by membership and maintained through sportsmanship. The Year End Awards Committee is empowered to investigate any and all acts of unsportsmanlike conduct and take whatever degree of disciplinary action deemed necessary, which may include the loss of eligibility to participate in the Regional Year End Awards Program. Committee action is subject to the rules as defined in Section II-G 3 of the WApHC by-laws. Any grievances or protests must be submitted in writing, giving the conditions, reasons and show bill. This must be submitted to the point keeper no more than 14 days from the last approved show season.
6. To be eligible to receive a WApHC Year End Award, at least 1 point must be gained in the area of approved show competition.
7. The best 12 shows will count toward the Regional Year-End Award. In case of a tie, the tie will be broken by the number of competitors beaten. For remaining ties, duplicate awards will be given.
8. If you cannot attend the Year End Banquet, please make arrangements to have someone pick up your award(s).
9. Deadline for Nomination Forms is two weeks prior to the first show. Nomination Forms must be mailed and postmarked two weeks prior to the first show to have the points count. It is the responsibility of each individual nominee to verify that the Regional Point Keeper has received their nomination form prior to the first show.

YOUTH & NON-PRO DIVISION

1. A nomination fee of \$5.00 for each youth and \$5.00 for each Non-Pro category must be paid to WApHC.
2. No youth points will be gained by showing a stallion. An unaltered colt, 1 year of older, is considered a stallion.
3. You must exhibit at a WApHC sponsored show to be eligible to participate in the Regional Year-End Awards Program.

HALTER & PERFORMANCE DIVISION

1. A nomination fee of \$5.00 per horse per category must be paid to WApHC.
2. You must exhibit at a WApHC sponsored show to be eligible to participate in the Regional Year-End Awards Program.

POINT SYSTEM

Points shall be awarded as follows: 1st place = 6pts; 2nd place = 5 pts; 3rd place = 4pts; 4th place = 3pts; 5th place = 2pts; 6th place = 1pt

A horse will gain 2 extra points for placing as Grand Champion in halter and 1 extra point for placing Reserve Champion in halter in an approved show. In the event that there are less than six entries in any class, points gained shall start with the total number of entries, i.e., 4 entries – points would be 4 – 3 – 2 – 1

WApHC General Membership Meeting

7 Lakes Golf Course

November 12, 2011

Meeting was called to order at 6:15 PM.

Attendance - Stephanie Jacobson, Toni Pflieger, Tina and Daryl Mahloch, Dan and Gloria Schaut, Christy and Wally Schoen, Chelsea and Nick Beil, Sandy & Mike Truntz, Chelsea Truntz, Bill Thiel, Kim Klinkner, Jean Quigley, Stephanie & Brittany DeKeyser

Treasurers report –Nick reported the current balance is \$4,748.70 – All approved this amount.

Equipment – Kim is putting together a list of who has what WApHC owned equipment. This will be emailed to all board members soon.

2012 shows – Discussions were held on how many and what kind of shows we want to have for next year. Topics of discussion were:

- Breed show day before the open show, May 26, 2012.
 - This would be a pleasure only show and would not include speed, reining or cattle.
 - If this show were held would we have 1 judge or 2 judges?
 - Tina mentioned that she spoke with the national office and they said that there are many states that are having more shows with fewer judges. The reasoning is that the costs are so great with having a 4 judge show and also that people like that instead of a show taking the entire weekend, it only takes 1 day.
 - Bill Thiel said that it is working well for other states to have a few single judge shows. The reason is that with a single judge show you are able to waive the national point fees.
 - Some members feel that if we have our regional show in Ozaukee on June 9th and 10th that this show is too close of a time frame with each other.
 - It was decided to table this discussion until we know more from the national club as to whether or not we are having our regional show.
- Regional show June 9th & 10th, 2012.
 - Tina spoke with the national club this week and they told her that another club has booked a show the same June weekend as us in Peoria, IL. If this is the case we cannot have our show this weekend. Tina talked with Kim this week about this and Kim forwarded the email correspondence between her and the national office. Tina will be calling the national office on Monday to talk with the lady in charge of this. According to the email between Kim and the national office we verbally were put on the books the beginning of October and the formal papers were filled out and emailed in the beginning of November when we were confirmed to have the grounds in Ozaukee.
 - It was mentioned that if we had to reschedule this show to a later date that then people would be more for having that one day show on May 26th.
 - Bill told us that the national club is changing some rules.
 - In order to qualify for the World show you now need to show under at least 5 different judges.

- Regional clubs can now hire only 3 judges and it will count as 4 judges. One judge will randomly be chosen by the national club and that judge will have double the points. This will save the club the costs of one judge. Nick thought that on average it cost us \$1300 per judge between their fees and the hotel.
- It was decided to table this discussion until we know more from the national club as to whether or not we are having this show.

Board Members -

- Current board members with terms expiring are Dan Schaut, Tiffany Kindschy-Christianson, Sandy Truntz, and Toni Pflieger.
- Toni and Sandy have agreed to stay on for another 2 year term. (Sandy did want it noted that she would step down if there was someone that wanted to take her place).
- Dan and Tiffany do not wish to continue on the board.
- Jess (Morgan) Fale and Lisa Krueger volunteered to become board members via telephone with Tina. If voted in as board members they both did not want to be considered for club officers.
 - *Kim Klinkner made motion to vote both Jess (Morgan) Fale and Lisa Krueger into board positions. 2nd was made by Tina Mahloch. All were in favor.*

NEWPHA Delegates – Gloria Schaut and Toni Pflieger have volunteered to be the delegates. Dan Schaut has volunteered to be the alternate. Meetings are the first Wednesday of the month.

- *Motion made by Sandy to have Gloria and Toni be the delegates with Dan as the alternate. 2nd was made by Tina. All were in favor.*

Complimentary Mailing List – Christy reported that there are 1404 members in our territory. 286 are members from WI. Bill Thiel volunteered to pay the postage for the 286 WI members. Christy is going to create the mailing and she will email it to the board members for approval.

Youth Director – Jean Quigley volunteered to become the youth director.

- *Stephanie Jacobson made the motion to make Jean Quigley the 2012 youth director. 2nd was made by Christy Schoen. All were in favor.*
- Stephanie DeKeyser will contact Kelly Schwartz to inform her.

WApHC Officers – Voting for club officers were done just by the board members that were in attendance.

- *Kim Klinkner nominates Tina Mahloch for President. 2nd was made by Nick Biel. All were in favor.*
- *Nick Biel nominates Stephanie Jacobson for Vice President. 2nd was made by Tina Mahloch. All were in favor.*
- *Tina Mahloch nominates Nick Beil for Treasurer. 2nd was made by Stephanie Jacobson. All were in favor.*
- *Stephanie Jacobson nominates Kim Klinkner for Secretary. 2nd was made by Sandy Truntz. All were in favor.*

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Nick Beil made a motion to adjourn this meeting at 7:18 PM. 2nd was made by Tina Mahloch. All were in favor.

 - Silent auction brought in \$250 for the futurity.

SHOWS:

June Regional Show

- Mississippi Valley had their show approved before us so they got June 9 & 10 as their show. We need to change our date of our June regional show.
- Kim spoke with Cedarburg and they have an opening for the weekend of June 22-24.

Kim made motion to have show June 22-24. 2nd was by Christy. All were in favor.

- Per the regional office, to get a show actually approved by the national club 12 halter classes and 4 open performance classes need to be checked on the show application. After discussion it was decided that Kim will fill out all the classes we are going to be having.
- Sandy spoke with her husband Mike to see if he would be willing to let us use their tractor, drag and watering system. She said that he would be willing to work with us on this but he will also want to be paid but it will not be as expensive as what the grounds were going to cost.
- Mike also mentioned that we should check on what the manure disposal includes. Kim will call Cedarburg to find out what that includes.

Toni made motion to have 3 judges (which will count as 4 sets of points). 2nd was by Kim. All were in favor.

- Tina will look for judges.
- Nick will take care of hiring the cattle.
- Toni will look into food vendors. Kim will first check with Ozaukee to see what requirements they have.

May Show

- Discussion was held and it was decided to only hold the open NEWPHA show on Memorial weekend.
- Dan Schaut volunteered to be the head of this show so we will be in contact with him to get “the ball rolling”.
- Gloria Schaut volunteered to run a food booth for us.

August Show

- Discussion was had that we need to have more than just the one regional show in June so it was thought that we should have another show in August. Places are pretty well booked up for next year so we need to book something right away.

Nick made motion to book August 10-12, 2012 at Cedarburg. 2nd made by Steph. All were in favor.

- At our next meeting we will be discussing further how we want to run this show.
 - How many judges do we want?
 - What days do we want to show? (possibly cattle on Friday and all other classes on Saturday)

Other Miscellaneous Items

- Tina would like every board member to go out and try to get some sponsors for hi point awards this year.
- Complimentary mailing list – Christy wanted to know everyone’s thoughts on the letter she emailed us.
 - Kim asked to have the show dates and locations added to the letter since we have these booked for 2012.
 - Kim also mentioned that we should make a note that we will be having some great hi point awards again this year.
 - Nick is going to be sending a check to Christy to cover the postage. Nick will then contact Bill Thiel to be reimbursed because Bill volunteered to pay for the postage to all WI national club members.

Treasurers Report

- Current balance is \$4,802.75.
- Approximately \$200 in expenses was to the national club for the regional show expenses.

Toni made motion to approve. 2nd was by Christy. All are in favor.

SHOWS:

Open Show (May 27th, 2012):

- Per Dan Schaut:
 - Dan wants to use the show bill from last year but some wording needs to be changed.
 - NEWPHA changed the signup for the high point awards to be signed up by noon.
 - Toni needs to let NEWPHA know how we feel about putting Western before English.
 - Kim said that this doesn't sound like a good idea as it is easier to have your horse going faster in the beginning of the day and slow them down towards the end. Also on warm days the horses would have sweat marks from the western tack showing.
 - *Toni makes motion to keep the English 1st and western 2nd. Christy made 2nd. All are in favor.*
 - Dan did the contract on November 17th for the fairground.
 - Dan will need the liability certificate. Nick will take care of this. Our insurance is up in May so it will be given to them when it is renewed.
 - Tina booked Keith Potter for the judge at \$300 with no mileage and no hotel.
 - Need to send the judge the contract, show bill, directions and NEWPHA bylaws. Tina will do this.
 - New to all NEWPHA show bills is a \$2 office fee. This is to take care of the cost of the office person.
 - Dan would like to put the complete show bill in the Horseman's News for May (not sure on this price yet). He would also like to list the show in the upcoming events for March and April which is \$10 per month.
 - *Nick makes motion to put complete show bill in Horseman's News for May and list the show in the upcoming events for March and April. 2nd by Toni. All in favor.*

10 Winter Horse Care Tips

Horses usually adapt easily and quickly to winter's challenges. But it's important to provide them with the extra care they need to stay safe and healthy when the cold winds blow.

1. As pasture quality or accessibility decreases, increase hay. The best heat source for your horse is extra hay. During the cold weather, it's best to increase the amount of hay, not concentrated feeds. Hay is digested in the cecum and colon which results in heat production by bacterial fermentation.
2. Get a pre-winter dental checkup. If your horse isn't grinding up her food properly, she may not be getting all the nutrients and energy out of it. Food is energy and energy creates warmth!
3. Even if your horses are stabled overnight, make sure they have a windbreak or shelter. This doesn't have to be an elaborate structure. Dense shrubbery or a stand of trees may be enough.
4. Consider blanketing during wet, very windy, or frigid weather. Like a wet down jacket, your horse's haircoat loses loft and won't hold body heat when it's wet. Older horses, horses unused to the cold or clipped horses may need blanketing.
5. Remove the blanket every day. Brush your horse and check for chafing and irritation from the blanket. Don't neglect grooming during the winter. A dirty, matted coat loses much of its ability to insulate.
6. If you put your horse in a stall during very cold weather, keep in mind she may still need blanketing. In the wild, horses forage, move continually and huddle together during cold weather to keep body temperatures up. These options are not available to a stalled horse and body temperatures can decline.
7. Inside the barn, be sure there is adequate ventilation but no direct drafts. Consider weather stripping the stalls. If your stall floors are cement, add rubber matting or extra bedding for insulation.
8. Be sure to provide adequate water during the winter. Horses may not drink enough if the water is very cold. Try to keep the water temperatures as far above freezing to increase water consumption and avoid dehydration.
9. Watch for frozen puddles around the water troughs. These can be really dangerous to your horse. Sprinkle alfalfa meal on the icy spots. Alfalfa contains nitrogen to promote melting and has a texture to provide traction. Non-toxic and cheap! Fireplace ashes and plain old dirt can provide traction, too.
10. Keep hooves in good condition. Well trimmed hooves will chip less, hold less snow, and provide better grip on slippery ground.
